

## The Indian Constitution Day



On 26<sup>th</sup> November 2019, at Degree College of Physical Education, Amravati in Auditorium Hall the Constitution day is celebrated. The main purpose of this program was to create awareness among the students about the human rights which was hand written by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar in the Indian constitution.
